The Junior Visitors’ Choice Award went to Kia Marie Sutcliffe from Millburn for her “Dog in a Car.” All entries were judged by professional judges. The judges included Roger Shule, Judy Haga, Catherine Nash, Judy Schieck, Mary Cunningham, Judy Chambers, Patti Rogers, and Lisa Clark. ### WHERE IS THE BAKE SALE?

Last year we did not meet our goal. Again I praise the Active Honorary for their bakery goods and help, for without their help we would have fallen decidedly short of our goal. Thank you, ladies. We hope you will participate again this year. We need you!

I attribute the shortfall to our newer members not being aware of this event; however, this year, I will make sure everyone is informed.

Please be aware that you all will be receiving a call to remind you of the event since this is during the summer months. The Fundraising Committee is dedicated to making this event a complete success this year.

We are asking for bakery that is appropriate for a bake sale during the summer months. We are outside in the heat. No cheese bakery products because we do not have refrigeration. It would be helpful if each member would divide their cookies, bars, etc. into smaller portions in bags or plates -- say, 6 smaller cookies or 3 large cookies or 2 very large cookies to a bag or plate. Cakes may be divided in half and put on paper plates. Use your imagination; a good presentation makes selling so much easier.

As in years past, store bought items DO NOT

SELL. Pillsbury and other manufacturers sell cookie dough that is very easy to make -- just slice and bake.

If you cannot participate or bake, a monetary donation would be lovely. The check should be made out to the Antioch Woman's Club with "Bake Sale" in the Memo portion of the check.

Please help us meet our goal this year. This provides the funds for our philanthropic works during the coming year. All of the Chairmen and Officers appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

## Our New Logo

A logo is a graphic mark or emblem commonly used by commercial enterprises, organizations and even individuals to aid and promote instant public recognition. Logos are either purely graphic (symbols/ icons) or are composed of the name of the organization (a logotype or wordmark). An example of an abstract mark is the check mark representing Nike, while an example of a representational mark is the "everyman" icon of PBS. Examples of well-known logotypes (wordmarks) are the striped IBM design, Mobil written in blue with a red "o" and CocaCola written in flowing red script.



The first permanent white settlement in Antioch was the Gage Brothers' cabin on Sequoit Creek, a tributary of the Fox River. In 1839, Hiram Buttrick built a sawmill along the creek, making Antioch a center of commerce. A replica of the mill has been built a few hundred feet downstream from where it once stood.
